

Thank you for joining us at Windsor Fair!

Below are the Campground Rules/Guidelines. We remind you that this is a family-oriented fair.

1. Campground speed is 5 miles per hour. Please remember that children, elderly and disabled campers share this area;
2. Public displays of intoxication, underage drinking, disorderly conduct and fighting or obscene language will not be tolerated and **will result in immediate eviction**;
3. Quiet time is **11 p.m. – 7:30 a.m.** Loud music is not acceptable at any time;
4. Fires are **not** allowed anywhere on the grounds;
5. **Animals**
 - Your pets are welcome in the campground but must not be left unattended outside of your camper **nor** inside if they disturb other campers (barking, growling, etc.) or if we are concerned for their well-being;
 - If concerns are not properly addressed, Windsor Fair may be forced to contact the local Animal Control Officer;
 - Please walk your dog in the field/parking areas – **you** are responsible for cleaning up after your pet;
 - You **must** have a current rabies tag/certificate.
6. The Departments of Environmental Protection & Health & Human Services make unannounced rounds in all camping areas on the grounds. Dumping of **gray and/or black** water is not acceptable at any time. Water must be in holding tanks and disposed of at one of the dumping stations or by the pump truck. Please be mindful that the inspectors are authorized to assess fines. If Windsor Fair is assessed a fine because of a violation at your site, that fee will be passed on to you. A pump truck is available on a daily basis.
7. **Do not** leave your vehicle in an empty campsite. All lots are reserved and others may arrive at any time. Remember that you would not want to arrive and find a vehicle parked in the site you paid for.
8. It is your responsibility to keep your campsite neat and to take care of your trash. Windsor Fair places barrels throughout the campground. They are emptied on a daily basis.
9. Do not walk through others campsites unless you have been invited to do so. We have received comments about this as it is inconsiderate.
10. Do not dig in or around your campsite or damage trees.
11. **New for 2012 – Lots 100 through 190**: Because of many vehicles blocking the way of other campers trying to park, **no** vehicles will be allowed at campsites 100 –190 from 12 noon on Thursday through 12 noon on Saturday. All other lots, absolutely **one** vehicle only. Once you have parked your camper, you will need to move your vehicle to the lower, free parking area.
12. Check out time – no later than 11 a.m.

Please remember that we have duties in other camping areas of the Fairgrounds, particularly the beginning of the week and Labor Day weekend. We make an effort to be at the office but for this reason, we are not always available. Should you have an emergency or need us for any other reason, please see the folks at the walk-in gate (go back onto the paved road & turn right and Gate 4 is just ahead on the left.).
